## Rondo Form

In some pieces, section A returns more than once! These pieces are longer and have 5 sections (Wow!) Here is an example of a piece in Rondo form:


How many bars long is this piece? $\qquad$ (This can be an important clue).
Music is often set out in 4 bar phrases. Look at the first 4 bars now... do you see any other similar bars? (Mark them with an ' $A$ ').

Now look at bars 5-8 and 13-16. These sections are different from the A section AND they are different from each other! So weill need the letters $\qquad$ and $\qquad$ for these sections.

So Rondo Form is set out like this: $\qquad$ _ $\qquad$

There will be $\qquad$ sections, with section A occurring $\qquad$ times
Since each section or phrase is often $\qquad$ bars long, Rondo Form examples are often $\qquad$ bars long (but not always!)
