## Writing Triads with Accidentals

Here are the primary triads (chords I, IV and V) of B flat major but they're missing some accidentals. You know the key signature consists of $\qquad$ and $\qquad$ , so now just find all the Bs and Es and put flats next to them! Easy!


Now add accidentals to these A major triads. (Key signature $=$ $\qquad$ , _ , _ ) )


And now... G minor! (Key signature $=$ $\qquad$ and $\qquad$ BUT remember you also need to raise the leading note!)


C minor (key sig = $\qquad$ , $\qquad$ and $\qquad$ ) is a bit trickier - you need to really think about what happens to the leading note in chord V !


And finally - try these E major chord in first inversion! (Key sig $=$ $\qquad$ _ , )
